

Access and transport

By train

Changing room



Monthey

Changing rooms will be available at the <u>Monthey ice rink</u> for riders departing from Monthey between 6.30am and 6pm.

Participants are reminded not to leave any belongings in the changing room. They should either store their bags in their car or place them in the vehicle that will transport their bags to the finish line in Champéry, where they can collect them.

Champéry

Participants can take a shower in the changing rooms at the Champéry sports centre (<u>Palladium</u>), just 5 minutes by bike from the Grand Paradis event village.

The Haute Cime course of the Alpine Gravel Challenge - Portes du Soleil is a gravel race that crosses Switzerland and France, starting in Monthey and finishing in Champéry on the Grand Paradis site. For ecological reasons, no cups or bottles will be provided at the refreshment stations. You will need to refill your own containers at the designated points. Please dispose of your waste in the bins provided on site.

The organisers would like to remind all riders that the race takes place on open roads that are not closed to traffic. As a result, the routes take in roads and paths shared with other road users, which means that each rider must comply with the federal law on road traffic and show respect for others at all times.

The safety of the Alpine Gravel Challenge route relies on meticulous organisation, designed to guarantee the well-being of participants at all times.

Enduro bikes to open the races: Enduro bikes, adapted to difficult terrain, are deployed to open the races, ensuring that the course is clear and safe before the riders arrive.

Road bikes for safety on the road sections: On the sections of the route that use open roads, road bikes are mobilised to supervise the cyclists and manage the traffic, ensuring their safety.

Team of first-aiders and first-aid posts: A specialised team of first-aiders and samaritans will be present throughout the route, with five first-aid posts located at strategic points. This organisation ensures rapid intervention and immediate, effective medical care in the event of an incident or injury.

Marshals along the route: Numerous marshals are positioned along the route at key points to monitor the safety of participants, provide information and react immediately in the event of an emergency.

Ambulance and helicopter support: Ambulances can be mobilised quickly if needed. In the event of a major emergency, a medical helicopter is also rapidly available to transport the injured to the appropriate care centres.



Bike



For the **HAUTE CIME COURSE**, and **PARCOURS FORTERESSE COURSE**, , the following bikes, fitted with tyres with a minimum cross-section of 38 mm (recommended 40 - 42 mm) are allowed:

- Specific bikes for Gravel fitted with round road handlebars
- Cyclo-cross bikes fitted with round road handlebars.

For the **CATHÉDRALE COURSE**, all bicycles are allowed.

We recommend

Bracket : single 40 x 50 or double 34 x 40



Tyre section : 40 or 42 mm



Equipments

Compulsory cycling and sports equipment for the entire event:

- Wearing an approved hard-shell helmet (CE standards) less than 5 years old, with the chinstrap fastened
- Handlebar ends fitted with caps
- 1 bicycle pump or at least 2 CO2 capsules, two spare inner tubes, supplemented by any other repair equipment
- A fully charged mobile phone
- A fully charged GPS computer, independent of the phone, alternatively, a fully-charged external battery for tracking using the smartphone's smartphone GPS meter,
- A bottle of water (minimum 50cl at the start of the race) and the minimum nutritional supplies for a 94 km race.
- A bell (optional)

Wear clothing suitable for the day's weather, as you'll be at altitude where temperatures can change quickly.

For the Haute Cime 94 km course, you will be able to leave a bag with your belongings, which will be transported to the Grand Paradis finish site and stored in a secure area. A system of labels, included in your runner's bag, will enable you to identify your personal belongings.





Race number and frame plate

Collection of race numbers/frame numbers and final registrations (deadline 6.00 pm on Saturday 7 September):

The number must be worn on the lower back.



The plate, which must be attached to the front of the handlebars, must **not be bent** under any circumstances, as this could damage the built-in timing chips and compromise the accuracy of the measured time.

Respecting these instructions will ensure that the event runs smoothly and that all participants are timed accurately.

Medals and jerseys

All cyclists finishing in the top 25% of their category during the qualifying event will be awarded a medal. These should be collected from the race office.

The top three finishers in each category will receive their medals during the awards ceremony.

The organisation of the TREK UCI Gravel World Series will donate a jersey for each winner in their age category (men and women). There will also be a special jersey for the elite men's and women's winner of the event.



Withdrawals and out of the race



Participants must manage their own return by bike. If a participant decides to withdraw from the race, they must report it at one of the control stations set up by the organizer. The station manager will then remove their bib and explain the available repatriation options.

If a participant has an accident, a mechanical breakdown, or a physical issue preventing them from reaching the nearest control station on their own, they are required to immediately notify their withdrawal by contacting the race management via the emergency number indicated and on their bib: **+41 79 589 56 43.**

Only cases approved by the race management will be taken care of by the end-of-race vehicle (sweep car). Any participant picked up by this vehicle will be removed from the competition.


The medical team, composed of rescuers and paramedics, also has the authority to disqualify a participant for medical reasons.
